Stream 1 qualification meets mandatory requirements for child protection and youth justice workers. This course aims to recognise and build on the skills of those who work in roles in community services, case management, social housing, family violence, child protection, etc. who are managing, coordinating and/or delivering person-centred services to individuals, families and communities. At this level, workers already have specialised skills in community services and work autonomously under broad directions from senior management.
